Petitions are available at your town clerk's office for school board members to serve on the proposed Harwood Unified Union School District Board. The petition to run for school board must be filed not less than 30 and no more than 40 days prior to the date of the vote to establish the union school district, which is June 7, 2016. Candidates for local office must submit a petition containing thirty (30) signatures or one percent of registered voters, whichever is less (17 V.S.A. §2681(b)). The petition shall contain the name of the candidate as it appears on the checklist, the name of the office, and the term of the office sought.
