

Chamber seeks support for sponsoring local events

The financial supporters of the Chamber's Marketing/Events Fund (MRV-ME) are currently reviewing applications that were submitted for grant requests to benefit a total of 20 local events. The total dollar amount of requests received this year is just over \$60,000. The current funds available to grant based upon current contribution levels is \$21,000.

"Right now, we don't have the financial resources to support all of these local events and most will not be able to get their requested grant amount and some will not get anything at all, as there is simply not enough money to go around," said chamber director Susan Klein.

The Mad River Valley Marketing & Events (MRV-ME) fund was created as a replacement to the Community Sponsorship Program (CSP) and is an opportunity for local businesses to support local events and marketing in the Mad River Valley. Investing in one or more "shares" gives a business a vote on how the money is disbursed to local events.

Klein explained that the cost of a share is based on 100 percent of a business' dues, up to \$1,500 maximum per share. Shares are payable over the next four months.

"You may also purchase multiple shares in multiples equal to one's dues calculation and receive multiple votes," she said.

Eighty percent of the funds collected will be earmarked toward event support, with disbursement at the vote of the contributors and 20 percent of the funds will be earmarked for miscellaneous marketing and any website enhancements deemed necessary to continue presenting the Mad River Valley to its maximum potential.

"It is not too late to make a pledge toward the event fund. Doing so by May 18 will allow the chamber to give more funds to local events.

More healthy, sustainable events means more economic stimulus for our community," she added.

Waterbury Long Term Recovery

Committee considers projects, partners and funding

Waterbury's Long Term Flood Recovery committee members will meet with local elected officials as well as representatives from the Shumlin administration and Vermont's Congressional delegation along with local and statewide grant makers, business and community leaders and FEMA officials to consider projects, partners and funders.

The meeting takes place today, May 3, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at St. Leo's Hall, 109 South Main Street, Waterbury (behind St. Andrew Catholic Church).

Since November, Waterbury community members have been working with FEMA recovery specialists to draft plans for a host of community projects that will help put Waterbury back on track after the devastation from Tropical Storm Irene. The group has created plans for almost two dozen projects covering a wide scope - from municipal investment to recreation to business development and climate resilience.

The meeting will allow

participants to advocate for particular projects and discuss the process and funding mechanisms and opportuni-

Warren Development Review Board

The Warren Development Review Board has scheduled a public hearing at 7:00 PM, Monday, May 21st, 2012 at the Warren Municipal Building to consider the following applications.

Application 2012-08-CU, Development on Steep Slopes: The Warren Zoning Administrator has referred the application, of the Mary Moffroid Revocable Trust, Mary Moffroid, Trustee, for a single family dwelling(SFD), 47' wide and 72' long, one story(2330 ft²), with decks (1585 ft²), a related walkway and a wildlife/conservation ponds on slopes exceeding 15%. The property is described as 4.9 ± acre parcel located at 572 Loop Rd. in the Rural Residential District (RR) (Parcel Id# 038002-00).

The applicant requests a waiver of item (2) on table 5.1 (Conditional use Application Requirements). This application requires review under Article 2, Table 2.2, Article 3, § 3.4(*Erosion Control & Development on Steep Slopes*) and Article 5, (*Development Review*), §5.3(*Conditional Use Review Standards*) of the Warren Land Use and Development Regulations as adopted by the Warren Select Board on August 24th, 2011.

Application 2012-11-CU, Front Setback Relief: The Warren Zoning Administrator has referred the application, of Judith P Macisaac for construction of an Accessory Structure(garage 24' X 24"). The existing parcel, a 1.22 -Acre lot with a Single Family Dwelling(SFD), on 226 Stony Hill Rd. and is located in the Rural Residential District(Parcel Id# 016005-505).

The applicant requests a waiver of item (2) on table 5.1 (Conditional use Application Requirements). This application requires review under Article 2, Table 2.2 (RR); Article 3, § 3.6(*Height & Setback Requirements*); and Article 5, § 5.3 (Conditional Use Review) of the Warren Land Use and Development Regulations as adopted by the Warren Select Board on August 24th, 2011.

Pursuant to 24 V.S.A. §§ 4464(a)(1)(C) and 4471(a), participation in this local proceeding is a prerequisite site to the right to take any subsequent appeal. Plans for these projects are available for public review at the Warren Town Clerk's Office during regular office hours.
