

Towns join together to haul clay for Harwood

With donated funds covering the cost of the diesel, Waitsfield's road department foreman, Rodney Jones, joined members of other local road departments in a caravan run to pick up a load of clay for Harwood Union's athletic fields.

On Tuesday, June 27, Jones and the others drove down to southern Vermont and crossed the border into Granville, New York, to collect the material.

The multi-town effort came to Jones and other road foremen from a Harwood parent who organized a volunteer effort to place new clay on the school's ballfields/infields. Each town donated a truck

and driver for four hours to collect the clay.

The Waitsfield Select Board approved the plan on June 26, although the board had also discussed and approved the plan on May 15 when the board voted to "support this volunteer effort and commit one driver and one truck for one trip to pick up a load of clay, contingent upon the Harwood Unified Union School District (HUUSD) considering compensating the town in part," according to the minutes.

Subsequent to that meeting, concerns were raised about town trucks crossing the Vermont border to get to the clay,

but because of the fact that the collection site was right across the border with New York, that issue was moot.

When the select board discussed it again last month, board member Sal Spinoso told the board that Jones told him he (Jones) would be covering the cost of the approximately 25 gallons of diesel fuel it would take to get there and back. Spinoso told the board that he indicated to Jones that he would share the fuel expense with him and that others may have donated as well. Board member Kari Dolan also expressed a willingness to share in the cost of fuel.

If no objection is made to the Probate Division of the Washington Superior Court within the above-specified time, the Warren Town Clerk shall issue a removal permit on September 3, 2017, which is a date forty-five days from the last date this Notice will be published.
