

 Notice of Public Hearing

The Town of Warren is considering making application to the State of Vermont for a Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery II Grant (Implementation) under the Vermont Community Development Program. A public hearing will be held at **Warren Municipal Building Conference Room (Old Library), 42 Cemetery Rd. Warren, VT on 11/3/14 at 6:00 PM** to obtain the views of citizens on community development, to furnish information concerning the amount of funds available and the range of community development activities that may be undertaken under this program, the impact to any historic and archaeological resources that may be affected by the proposed project, and to give affected citizens the opportunity to examine the proposed statement of projected use of these funds. The proposal is to apply \$301,033 in CDBG-DR II Funds, which will be used to accomplish the following activities:

**Warren Village Main Street Improvement Plan**  
 The proposal for discussion is the result of Vermont Downtown Action Team (V-DAT) recommendations that build upon and further previous sidewalk and traffic calming studies (2004 Warren Village Pedestrian Enhancement Plan, Sidewalk Feasibility Study, 2009 Warren School Travel Plan, 2013 Warren Safe Routes to School Study). The purpose of the Warren Village Main Street Improvement Project is to develop streetscaping and traffic calming measures between Village Bridge and Brook Road. The goals of the project are:

- To provide orientation, safety, accessibility and comfort to walkers, bicyclists, and other multi-modal users in the Village;
- To develop pedestrian improvements that will promote and encourage usage and ultimately reduce overall traffic speed in the area;
- To develop landscape and gateway enhancements that complement and improve the Village aesthetic, slow traffic, and provide a sense of welcome to the Village.

# Waitsfield Elementary trail goes before select board

At their meeting on Monday, October 13, Waitsfield Select Board approved a request from the Mad River Path Association to install a small portion of the trail on town-owned land adjacent to General Wait House and possibly Waitsfield Fire Station.

Mad River Path Association executive director William Flender presented the plan for the trail, which will be built behind Waitsfield Elementary School on four acres of land that the association purchased this past spring and donated to the school, after creating a trail easement on it.

The association also received a donation of a second trail easement across land located just north of the school

so that combined, the two easements will allow for the construction of a half-mile trail parallel to the Mad River. The new trail will connect the school, the Mad River Valley Visitors Center at General Wait House and ultimately the village's sidewalk. A short set of steps will also be installed from the trail down the riverbank to provide public access to the Mad River.

The proposed trail will start at the back of the General Wait House parking lot and run east, curving around the southern end of the school's athletic field and the Waitsfield cemetery to the top of the riverbank. While the majority of the trail will be located on school-owned land, a small portion of it could stray onto Waitsfield fire station proper-

ty, Flender told the board last Monday.

The select board approved Mad River Path Association's request for installation, with the condition that if parking by people using the trail became a problem at either General Wait House or Waitsfield fire station, the association would put up signs to discourage it.

With the board's approval, the association is now embarking on the permitting process for the trail, with plans to start on its construction at the end of the school year this coming June. So far, the trail has been made possible by over \$60,000 in private donations and by a \$20,000 grant from the Vermont Recreation Trails Program.

# Washington West assesses next year's finances

Washington West Supervisory Union (WWSU) is assessing its finances for the upcoming school year.

During a preliminary con-

versation at its meeting on Wednesday, October 8, the WWSU executive committee discussed what it will move into its budget. It has sched-

uled the first budget run-through for its meeting on Wednesday, November 12.

The budget will be finalized at the supervisory union's meeting on December 10 and voted on at the full board meeting on January 5 or 12. The public is invited to attend the meetings, which take place at 5:30 p.m. in the WWSU conference room.

Members of the public do not directly vote on the supervisory union budget. Each school has representatives who serve on the executive committee and vote on that budget. The WWSU budget is wrapped into each school's budget as a line item.

The proposed FY2015 budgets for each WWSU school are available on the supervisory union's website, at [wwsu.org](http://wwsu.org), as is a 2013-2014 financial report from the Washington West central office.
